


Blood Drive


On July 5 & 6, Skip and Franny had another strong turn out for the 4th Blood Drive of the year.

Webmaster News

As of 7/31/25

July has been a relatively slow month while maintaining the webpage, with the addition of new events (e.g. Phlockings each month) and removal of past/expired events. This is a little harder than it sounds, i.e. there are both computer and mobile views that need to be coordinated – changing one has ripple effects with the other. We're diligent in making it seamless for your navigation experience.

Our homepage has been getting a little cluttered, so we made some changes. We've added icons to the webpage buttons for visual association of webpage links, and moved some objects around to streamline the page. We changed buttons from "Board Members" to "Coco-Nutz" and "Membership" to "New Members" to be consistent with content. And there's new arrows to navigate you back to the top of lengthy webpages. As an aside, our Wix webpage host removed support for tooltips, i.e. the text that appears when you hover your mouse over a flyer. Nonetheless, I think you'll find the webpages a little more intuitive to navigate.

On July 20 at the Belle Glade CC phlocking, Mark-the-Shark and Marsha Herring, presented a \$1000 check to Colleen Larson, President of It Takes A Village.

In 2014, a group of people came together with a passion for children and the care for our future. As a result, It Takes a Village for Change (ITAV) initially was formed, partnering with the Wildwood Elementary School (WWES) of Sumter Co, a Title I School. This effort focuses on Grades K-4 to enrich the lives of the children.++

ITAV initiates 2-3 fundraisers a year to supplement service projects that benefit children locally. Planned for November 15th at the Laurel Manor RC, ITAV's charity fundraiser committee is presenting "The Village Chicks" who will perform with their singing and audience participation skits. This fundraiser will benefit the WWES children and teachers. Throughout the school year, ITAV also hosts Teacher Appreciation events, Literacy events, and much more. ITAV currently works to connect with other organizations and clubs to generate partnership and resources.

Annually, ITAV also charters a bus for the 3rd grade trip to LogoLand and the 4th grade trip to St. Augustine.

ITAV have about 45 volunteers who participate in the fundraisers, Teacher Appreciation Luncheon, Horizon After Care Program, and the PBS (Positive Behavior School) Store to name a few. Pineapple Bourbon Ice Tea

With notes of fresh fruit, caramel and spice, Four Roses Bourbon pairs well with both the tropical flavors of pineapple, and the rich aromatics and flavors of malt in black iced tea.

INGREDIENTS

½ oz Four Roses Bourbon

¾ oz Four Roses honey (see note

below)

¾ oz Fresh lemon juice

2 oz lced tea

3-4 pieces of Pineapple pieces

Garnish with Pineapple



DIRECTIONS

Muddle pineapple in shaker. Combine all ingredients (except iced tea) in shaker. Add ice and shake for fifteen seconds, or until cocktail is properly diluted and well chilled. Add iced tea. Double strain into a glass over fresh ice. Garnish with fruit.

NOTE: Four Roses Honey is a bourbon barrel-aged honey created in partnership with the Bohman Bee Company. It is aged in ex-Four Roses barrels that once aged their Small Batch bourbon, imparting a rich flavor profile with tasting notes of ripened red berries and dried spices. It is not found locally as of yet, but you can use regular honey.

Earning Parrot Points

Some of you might ask, What are volunteer Parrot Points and what are they used for? Members can earn Parrot Points from volunteering at our club's various events. For example: taking attendance at Phlockings, selling 50/50 tickets, donating blood, volunteering at the blood drive, helping at parties, and/or volunteering at any of our 3 big events per year (chili cook off, poker run, golf tournament).

Accumulating Parrot Points

Points are accumulated on a "rolling" 12 month period, i.e., from February to January or July to June. The rolling system works when points for a new month are posted and the points for the prior year period are dropped. For example: July points for the current year are posted, the July points for the previous year will drop off. The only way your accumulated Parrot Point totals will change is when a new month is tallied and posted.

Posting Monthly Parrot Points

The total of all Members' Parrot Points are posted each month on our website:

https://villagesparrotheads.com, Quick Links, Check Earned Points. Monthly, event chairs submit the earned Parrot Points to me to track, tally, and post for the member's review. Check your points each month and let me know if you think any Parrot Points are missing.

Thanking you, our Members

Parrot Points are given to those members rewarding the volunteer work they have done for our club. And this is one of the ways we thank you for volunteering.

Parrot Points are then recognized to purchase advance ticket sales, advance priority event seating, receive an invitation to the annual Volunteer Appreciation event (specific yearly total must be accumulated), and to receive a Volunteer Appreciation Pin in recognition for your Volunteer efforts.

And, you do not lose Parrot Points if you use them to purchase advance ticket sales or priority seating.

All proceeds from these will be donated to Alzheimer's.


This hotel is magnificent. It has a large resort pool, many restaurants and bars, and it is right on the beach.
