Parrot Head Profile of Mike Peacock Chair of "5 'Clock Somewhere" events



Mike Peacock and his wife Donna arrived in The Villages approximately 11 years ago, and joined The Parrot Heads about 9 years ago. They moved from Warminster, Pennsylvania and have made their home in The Village of Chatham.

We spoke with Mike to learn more about him, his life as a Villager and as a Parrot Head.

1. Mike, how did you first become acquainted with the Parrot Heads?

I knew Lee Caron before joining Parrot Heads. Donna and I went to the squares quite a bit where we met Will Stone, who convinced us to join.

2. Please name 2 of your favorite things about The Parrot Heads.

The cruises with Larry Turner and his wife, Judy, were terrific. We also really enjoyed the week trip to Sanibel Island with the Parrot Heads. Of course, we love the parties and Phlockings as well.

- 3. Where are you from originally?
- I was born in Philadelphia. Then my family moved to Warminster, Pennsylvania where I met and married Donna, my high school sweetheart. We've been married 47 years.
- 4. Before you became a Villager, what kind of work were you involved in?

I had an extermination business, which I owned and operated for 35 years along with a commercial cleaning business. Donna was a court reporter for 11 years. But, I'm still working.

- 5. What sort of work do you do now, Mike?
- I started a golf rental business which specializes in Yamaha Golf Carts, providing drop off and pick up service. We have a fleet of 75 carts that includes 2 and 4 seaters with some 4 seaters that face forward. The name of the business is Son and Snowbirds; www.sonandsnowbirds.com.
- 6. What are your 2 favorite things about The Villages?

Spending time with my wife, Donna and hanging out with the Parrot Head guys.

7. What kind of volunteer work are you involved in as a member of The Parrotheads?

For the past year, I've been serving as the Chairperson of <u>5 O' Clock Somewhere</u>. My best friend, Will Stone, recruited me into this position. Every other month we hold a <u>5 O'Clock Somewhere</u> at a local restaurant. In May it was at Gators Dockside in Brownwood; where we had about 150 people attend. June 20th we met at City Fire in Lake Sumter Landing. I'm responsible for booking the place, negotiating any special meal or drink deals for our group and getting the entertainment. We'll have the next one probably sometime in August. We try to feature different programs each time. Sometimes we do a pool party at The Waterfront Inn at Lake Sumter Landing. That's very popular. Before this, my Grandson, Dominic Jones (who I sometimes call "Parakeet") and I used to sell 50/50 tickets at The Mallory Phlockings.
