

Vinny and his wife, Linda, bought their home in The Village of Gilchrist in May 2013 and made it their full time residence later that August. They joined The Parrot Heads within a year of arriving in The Villages.

1. Vinny, how did you first become acquainted with the Parrot Heads?

Our neighbors were Parrot Heads, so we attended a Phlocking as their guests and joined shortly thereafter.

2. Where are you from originally? I'm from Kings Park in Suffolk County, Long Island, New York

3. Before you became a Villager, what kind of work were you involved in?

I worked for Con Edison in NYC as a first responder for gas leaks in Manhattan. I was working in The Bronx on 9-11 and was called into Manhattan that night at 5 pm to start work restoring and rerouting gas mains throughout lower Manhattan. My work with Con Ed continued in Manhattan from that time forward until Linda and I relocated here to The Villages.

4. What sort of work do you do now?

Like a lot of folks, I've gotten too busy to work now that we're in The Villages. I'm on 2 softball leagues, play golf three times a week, horse shoes once a week, and pickle ball four times a week. I play Poker, volunteer at The Wildwood Soup Kitchen three times a week and am a first responder for AED and CPR in our Gilchrist Village. I'm also a caregiver for my 95 year old Mother who lives at Sumter Place.

5. What kind of volunteer work are you involved in as a member of The Parrot Heads? I have a pickup truck that I use to set up and pick up tents after events. If they need help with the Poker Run, I help with my truck to handle set up and cleanup activities. Whatever the Parrot Heads need, I've got the wheels and I am ready to help.

6. What are your 2 favorite things about The Villages?

The diversity of the people who come from all over is something I like. It's wonderful to hear stories about other people and places, and I also like all the variety of activities you can get involved in here. There are so many choices available; you can stay as busy as you want.

7. Please name 2 of your favorite things about The Parrot Heads.

It's great fun, and I also really like all the local charities they get involved in. The Parrot Heads offers us so many opportunities to give back to charities that we support. I had a chance to do this with a 50/50 Hospice raffle I won which enabled me to donate the \$250 winnings back to Hospice which meant a lot to me. I also like all the different day trips that The Parrot Heads sponsor and the Phlockings. There's so many neat people involved in The Parrot Heads. It's just a terrific organization.
