INTERVIEW WITH AL BROSS, 2ND CLUB PRESIDENT

Our Parrot Head Profile this month features Al Bross. Al and Sue Bross have lived in The Villages for about 12 years; two years in Woodbury and ten years in El Santiago which was close to the center of all the activities at that time.

Al and Sue were familiar with the Parrot Heads from their time in Cincinnati where Jimmy Buffett would often come and perform for five days at a time. When they moved to the Villages there was not a Parrot Head Club here because there was a club in Ocala and the club statutes required permission to be given from any club within thirty miles before a new club could be started.

They joined the Ocala club and became very good friends with the president and vice-president of that club. Sue served as secretary of the Ocala club. They were able to get a release from the Ocala club to start a Parrot Head Club in The Villages. They started with the required thirty-three members and it has grown ever since. All and Sue raised the money to start the club here by having a swim party for people in The Villages.



Dave McDougall was president for the first three years, with AI as vice-president. AI was the second president of The Villages Parrot Head Club and Sue served as vice-president for the first couple of years and later as secretary. The original monthly meetings which included fund raising for various charities were held at area restaurants where the club would pay for half of the entertainment and were very well received by the membership and the venues where the meetings were held. The Meetings at the original EI Santiago Restaurant were so popular the membership of the club just grew by leaps and bounds. From the original thirty-three members up to about thirteen hundred today!

Al is not a golfer, but really enjoyed playing pickle ball. He and Sue joined the Cincinnati Club and several other clubs, but for them, there was just nothing like the Parrot Heads!

Al is originally from Cincinnati, Ohio. He graduated with a BA from the University of San Diego, CA, and a Masters from Xavier University and the University of Cincinnati. He worked for the Cincinnati school system for thirty-four years as a teacher, a counselor, and assistant principal. They retired in their early fifties and moved to Oviedo FL. Not being ready for a life of leisure yet, they went to work for the University of Central Florida. Al was Director of Testing and Evaluation and Sue worked for the Provost. After ten years there, they retired again and moved to the Villages.

Al and Sue are currently working as volunteers running the Parrot Head Clothing Drives. The clothing for women goes to Haven House in Leesburg where the items of clothing are greatly appreciated as often the women have to leave a dangerous situation with nothing but the clothes on their backs. The men's clothing goes to the Habitat for Humanity thrift shop.

Al's favorite things about the Parrot Heads are the friendships that he has formed that are almost like family and of course the music!

He would advise new members to work in the club, run for an office, or get involved in the fund raising activities where you will meet people who can become lifelong friends.
