With her photography and film credentials, and proximity to Washington, DC, Lisa secured a job as a photo-journalist for Women Journalists of Washington (WPOW), a 501.C.3 non-profit organization. Lisa's job took her to numerous locations and symposiums across the country and overseas. It was while Lisa was photographing an orphanage in South Korea that an apartment building caught fire. Being on scene and aware of the dangers, Lisa put down her camera and helped the orphans escape the fire. Putting herself at personal risk and potentially not taking that Pulitzer-prize winning photograph got the attention of Jimmy Buffett, who was putting together a photo-collage of his 57 albums at the time. He reached out and took Lisa under his wing, and she has been a Parrothead ever since accepting the position as Vice President & First Mate with The Villages Parrot Heads Club.



Kathi Purdy

Kathi was born in Trenton, NJ to a minister and a mother working for the State of New Jersey. Kathi was athletic in her younger years, playing women's hockey with an affiliate of the New Jersey Devils. One night while carousing in Princeton, NJ at Tommy Bar & Tap, part of the Devils Bar Network, Kathy got involved in a fight with patrons who supported the opposing team. Implicated in the serious wounding of a patron by a senior member of a local white supremist group, Kathy reached an agreement with the courts to testify for the prosecution in exchange for a reduced charge and entry into the Witness Protection Program.

While on a tour with the Devils, Kathi had become intrigued with the United States Peace Corps headquartered in Washington, DC. Under the Witness Protection Program, Kathi joined the Peace Corps under an assumed name and took on a 2-year commitment as an Emergence Relief Advisor. Kathy was deployed to Tuva, Spain in 1977 following a major landslide that took several lives, and Singapore in 1978 who was suffering from major catastrophic flooding.

Marsha Herring
