

November Webmaster News

New this month, we've posted the 2026 <u>draft Bylaws</u> to the website homepage Quick Links for membership review. The <u>current Bylaws</u> posted in the Documents webpage were written in Dec 2003, revised Sep 2006 and Dec 2011, with a follow-on amendment in 2021. A lot of requirements were dated and sorely in need of an update. An obvious example, we deleted the requirement for membership to keep copies of their applications on file (Article II.B.2, we laughed...). Aside from editorial changes throughout, we eliminated the requirement for other written applications and reports with everything now online.

Consistent with club policy, we also amended the Code of Conduct to refrain from politics. We also added the responsibilities currently being done by the Vice President and Secretary, in addition a requirement for a member must be in good standing for 1 year to be an officer.

Also, several areas were moved to the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) as being procedural in nature. While I was chair, Kudos to the Bylaws Committee (Ren Titus, Ross Irlam, Lori Hollister and Paul Macleod) in pulling this together. The Bylaws have been through a rigorous review by the Committee and the Coco-Nutz, and will be presented in December for general membership vote (yes or no to accept the draft Bylaws as written).

We'll also be reviewing other club websites for good ideas to improve our websites, and are looking at alternatives to Ticketleap for ticketing. If you have any suggestions to add or enhance capabilities, feel free to use the website suggestion box to submit your ideas!





Earning Parrot Points

Some of you might ask, What are volunteer Parrot Points and what are they used for? Members can earn Parrot Points from volunteering at our club's various events. For example: taking attendance at Phlockings, selling 50/50 tickets, donating blood, volunteering at the blood drive, helping at parties, and/or volunteering at any of our 3 big events per year (chili cook off, poker run, golf tournament).

Accumulating Parrot Points

Points are accumulated on a "rolling" 12 month period, i.e., from February to January or July to June. The rolling system works when points for a new month are posted and the points for the prior year period are dropped. For example: July points for the current year are posted, the July points for the previous year will drop off. The only way your accumulated Parrot Point totals will change is when a new month is tallied and posted.

Posting Monthly Parrot Points

The total of all Members' Parrot Points are posted each month on our website: https://villagesparrotheads.com, Quick Links, Check Earned Points. Monthly, event chairs submit the earned Parrot Points to me to track, tally, and post for the member's review. Check your points each month and let me know if you think any Parrot Points are missing.

Thanking you, our Members

Parrot Points are given to those members rewarding the volunteer work they have done for our club. And this is one of the ways we thank you for volunteering.

Parrot Points are then recognized to purchase advance ticket sales, advance priority event seating, receive an invitation to the annual Volunteer Appreciation event (specific yearly total must be accumulated), and to receive a Volunteer Appreciation Pin in recognition for your Volunteer efforts.

And, you do not lose Parrot Points if you use them to purchase advance ticket sales or priority seating.


