

INTERVIEW WITH GEORGE AND VIRGINIA VAN SANTEN



The VanSanten's moved to the Villages from Portage, Indiana 19 years ago, and became Parrothead members approximately 7 years ago. David Macdougall, the 'Founding Father' of the Villages Parrothead Club, was a neighbor of theirs, so that's how they got involved in the club. George VanSanten hails from Hoboken, New Jersey, and his wife, Ginny is originally from Chicago. They met and worked together at a coil-coating company in Portage, Indiana, where they married and have been teaming up as a dynamic duo ever since. Both George and Ginny received Golden Parrot Awards for their exceptional volunteer efforts in 2015. George and Ginny adhere to the saying, "Things turn out best for those who make the best out of the way things turn out," and things happen to turn out very well for those things George and Ginny set their hearts and vision on.

<u>George and Ginny, please name 2 of your favorite things about the Parrotheads</u>.

The camaraderie, charitable activities, great people we meet and the fun events that the Parrotheads put together.

George, what kind of volunteer work are you involved in as a member of the Parrotheads? I've spent the past 7 years volunteering at the hospital in the driver group and served as the Co-Chair of that group for a time also. This involved training as well as overseeing people involved in the driver group. Ginny and I were also involved in cleaning Lake Paradise here at The Villages. We would retrieve debris around and inside the lake that might be harmful to the environment as well the ducks, geese and fish using the lake. We were involved in this activity for many years, but had to give it up due to some medical reasons.

Ginny, tell us about your Parrothead volunteer activities.

Like George, I've been volunteering at the hospital for the last 7 years in various departments. Right now, I'm serving at the information desk. In the past, like George said, we both worked together cleaning up Lake Paradise.

George, you've been involved in lots of volunteer activities throughout your life. Can you tell us a little bit more about some of these volunteer efforts?

Well, I was the past President of The Chamber of Commerce in Portage, Indiana; served on their Planning and Zoning Commissions, Eagles Club and Crime Stoppers. I chaired a committee that brought a 5-day Grand Prix Jamboree to Portage, Indiana, and also started an effort to install a break wall off the Port of Indiana to improve small boat/ recreational safety. After that the Park Department followed up with a waterfront recreation center and marina which helped build business in the area. We also enabled people to obtain a 1 day fishing license which helped promote additional tourism in the port area. With the Crime Stoppers group, I helped raise \$50,000 for the apprehension, arrest and conviction of a person who had abducted a 7 year old girl from our area. The police were successful in apprehending and prosecuting the person who was turned in by a relative looking to get part of the reward money.

<u>I understand you two have been involved in some other joint business efforts besides</u>
<u>your work in the coil-coating industry. Can you tell our readers a little bit about that?</u>

Ginny: After settling into The Villages lifestyle, we decided we needed more challenges, so we checked out Marion

Market, decided to rent a booth and start a retail business. We sold artificial trees and silk flower arrangements. Neither one of us had ever done anything like this before, so we taught ourselves the business from the ground up. We ran it very successfully for about 12 years doing contracts with decorators, the City Hall of Wildwood and Harbor Hills Country Club just to name a few. When we decided to stop the business, we liquidated the inventory and took a cruise.
