
FOOD PANTRY ITEMS ALWAYS NEEDED

THURMAN SHURTLEFF INTERVIEW



Thurman and his wife, Karen bought their Villages home in 2005, and made it their full time residence in December 2005. They joined The Parrot Heads in June 2006. They reside in The Village of Poinciana.

1. Thurman, how did you first become acquainted with the Parrot Heads?

We found out by accident about a Jimmy Buffet Club here at The Villages. Once we discovered that they were The Parrot Heads, we attended one of their meetings at El Santiago and joined right after that. We've been members ever since.

Where are you from originally?I was born in West Texas and grew up in Dallas.

3. Before you became a Villager, what kind of work were you involved in?

I worked at a hospital in various jobs while I was attending college. One of my jobs included working as an orderly the X-Ray department. I went through the ROTC with a two year work commitment to the military and asked to serve in the Medical Service Corp. This enabled me to serve in various roles within the Army's healthcare administration department for 22 years. After that I worked in public healthcare administration in the DC Metro area for 13 years. My healthcare career concluded with an 8 year stint as a pro-bono consultant with a retirement community in Carlsbad, Mexico.

4. What sort of work do you do now?

I'm focused on volunteer work with The Parrot Heads currently, but before that I spent about 4 years serving on the Administrators Advisory Committee with The Villages Hospital.

5. What kind of volunteer work are you involved in as a member of The Parrot Heads?

I've been volunteering on the Charity Committee since 2009, and spent a year or so serving as their Chairman. The Executive Committee gives us a target fund to recommend for distribution between the local charities. We try to target those charities that give the most with the least amount of expense so they can do the greatest good as a charity. The charities are vetted to make sure they qualify and are compliant with state regulations. We also started a program working with partner sponsors like Cody's who holds 4-5 fundraisers with The Parrot Heads over the course of a year. We have raffles for various things, hold 50/50's where half of the funds are distributed to the charity the Fund Raiser sponsors and the other half to members.

6. What are your 2 favorite things about The Villages?

Parrot Heads is my number 1 favorite thing. And after that, it would be my neighborhood which is very social and supportive...almost like a second family.

7. Please name 2 of your favorite things about The Parrot Heads.

The Charity Committee is one of my favorite things for one thing and working with other volunteer commitments that I am capable of doing.

8. Would you have any advice to share with new Parrot Head members? Yes, get involved in /olunteering so you can get more closely acquainted with other Parrot Head members. Some of the closest friends we have in The Villages we met through volunteer activities with The Parrot Heads.
