Earning Parrot Points

Some of you might ask, What are volunteer Parrot Points and what are they used for? Members can earn Parrot Points from volunteering at our club's various events. For example: taking attendance at Phlockings, selling 50/50 tickets, donating blood, volunteering at the blood drive, helping at parties, and/or volunteering at any of our 3 big events per year (chili cook off, poker run, golf tournament).

Accumulating Parrot Points

Points are accumulated on a "rolling" 12 month period, i.e., from February to January or July to June. The rolling system works when points for a new month are posted and the points for the prior year period are dropped. For example: July points for the current year are posted, the July points for the previous year will drop off. The only way your accumulated Parrot Point totals will change is when a new month is tallied and posted.

Posting Monthly Parrot Points

The total of all Members' Parrot Points are posted each month on our website: villagesparrotheads.com, Quick Links, Check Earned Points. Monthly, event chairs submit the earned Parrot Points to me to track, tally, and post for the member's review. Check your points each month and let me know if you think any Parrot Points are missing.

Thanking you, our Members

Parrot Points are given to those members rewarding the volunteer work they have done for our club. And this is one of the ways we thank you for volunteering. Parrot Points are then recognized to purchase advance ticket sales, advance priority event seating, receive an invitation to the annual Volunteer Appreciation event (specific yearly total must be accumulated), and to receive a Volunteer Appreciation Pin in recognition for your Volunteer efforts. And, you do not lose Parrot Points if you use them to purchase advance ticket sales or priority seating.



NEW "CHECK-IN" PROCEDURES at our phlockings effective September 1st

- 1. Come to a phlocking
- 2. Scan your lanyard's QR code
- 3. Get a chance at a \$25 gift card.

At all phlockings starting in <u>September</u>, you will need to scan your lanyard QR code when you enter. Each greeter will use a computer tablet to scan your lanyard QR code. If you have not received your QR code, you can get it at any phlocking. You then can scan your QR code with a greeter. So, you will need to wear your lanyards at all phlockings.

Note: You MUST use the QR code that we created for you.

And, thanks to Havana CC, we will be giving away a \$25 gift card at each Havana Lunch Phlocking to a random member who has checked in at any phlocking the previous month. The more you come to phlockings and check in using your QR code, the more chances you will have to win. Example: If you check in at all 3 phlockings, you will get 3 chances. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF CHARITIES

Angel Wigs of Hope: Provide support to women who have cancer.

Combat Veterans to Careers: Provides services for combat veterans and assist them in finding careers.

Friends of SOZO Kids: A Villages club that supports the children living in Ocala National Forest. They purchase school supplies and provide any help that might be needed for these children.

Humane Society: A no kill animal shelter.

It Takes a Villages: A Villages club that supports the teachers and students of Wildwood Elementary. Providing backpacks, school supplies and funding for various events.

Operation Shoebox: Puts together care packages and mails them to our troops

Project SOS (Supporting Our Soldiers): Works with veterans in Sumter, Lake and Marion Counties to provide mobility devices and wheel chairs to disabled veterans and also feed, shelter and provide healthcare to military families who live in the local forests.

Service Dogs for Vets: Provides trained dogs for disabled veterans

Shepherd Light House: A shelter for women with children up to 9 years old and transitions them back into society.

Veterans Helping Veterans: Provides services to veterans in Marion county which include counseling, referral, advocacy, and direct social service assistance, including food and limited financial assistance for such items such as rent, utilities, special dietary needs.

Wildwood Soup Kitchen: Part of the outreach ministry for United Presbyterian Church of Wildwood. This soup kitchen serves between 200 & 300 hot lunches everyday for the homeless in the Wildwood area.

Ziggy's Haven: Ziggy's takes unwanted parrots, also provides adoption opportunities for folks who want to own a parrot. Located in Inverness, FL.
