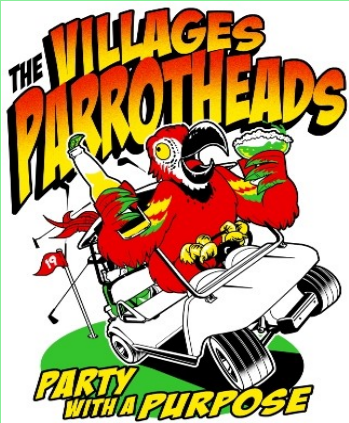

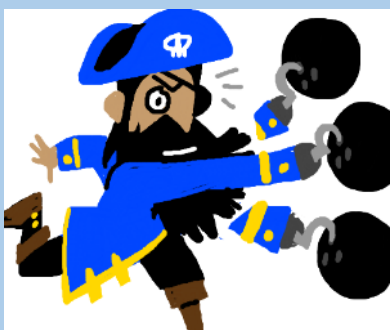


Poker Run

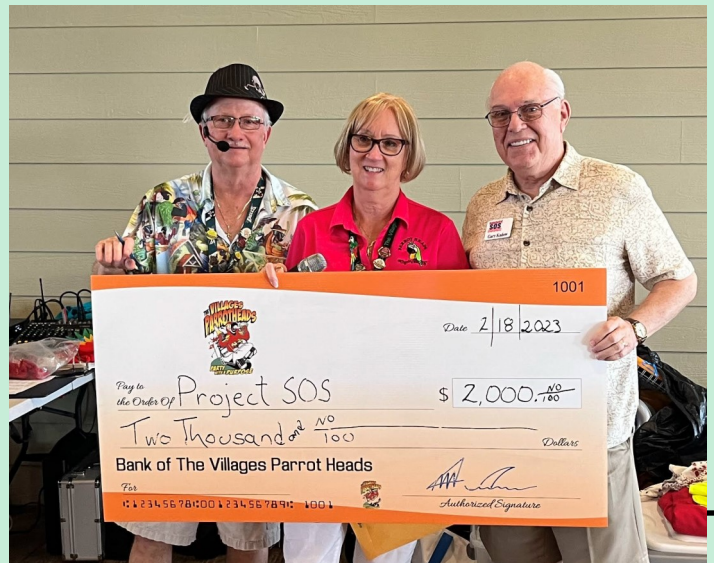


Cody's Fundraiser for 2023

2. Last year we raised just over \$24,000. This where the donations come from when we give out the big checks at our phlockings.

3. This is a Phun day that our members, phamily, phriends, and neighbors can all participate in so let everyone know. And we need your participation. (The Rotary club decided to have their poker run on the same day, at the polo grounds, and we need you to support OUR club)

4. There are 2 portions of our poker run, 1st the Poker run itself: It only cost \$5 per hand to enter. You can purchase as many hands as you like. You can start at any of the locations: Colony Cottage Rec center, Seabreeze Rec center, Havana CC, and/or Palmers CC. We finish at Laurel Manor Rec Center with a Basket raffle/festival. You can also buy a wild card for \$10 at your starting point. Get a card at each station or get all at Laurel Manor.

5. In the Basket Raffle/festival portion, we all get together at the gazebo at Laurel Manor Rec center in a picnic type atmosphere. Bring your chairs, coolers, refreshments, etc..
