

You will get to spend the day at one of Florida's most pristine





The Story of Jimmy Buffett (Part 2) by Mark "the Shark" (with help from Wikipedia)

Buffett was born on Christmas Day 1946, in Pascagoula, Mississippi, and spent part of his childhood in Mobile, Alabama. He later lived in Fairhope, Alabama. He is the son of Mary Lorraine (née Peets) and James Delaney Buffett Jr. During his grade school years, he attended St. Ignatius School, where he played the trombone in the school band. As a child he was exposed to sailing through his grandfather. These experiences would go on to influence his later music. He graduated from McGill Institute for Boys in 1964. He began playing guitar during his first year at Auburn University before continuing his college years at Pearl River Community College and the University of Southern Mississippi in Hattiesburg, Mississippi where he received a bachelor's degree in history in 1969.

He is an initiate of Kappa Sigma fraternity at the University of Southern Mississippi. After graduating from college, Jimmy Buffett worked as a correspondent for *Billboard* magazine in Nashville, breaking the news of the separation of Flatt and Scruggs which is the answer to Barb Hopper's trivia question.

That's right, for the first time, we sold Wristbands and shirts ONLINE. Those 140 orders generated over \$3200.00 in income. We not only sold WRISTBANDS, but we sold 3 different shirt bodies in 7 sizes. That means we had 22 different items you could buy all online. That's a great start with lots of potential for the future use of ONLINE sales.

Let's look at the membership numbers. They are interesting. We currently have 1152 members. That is within 3 members of the total for last year. Out of 1154 members at the end of last year, almost 900 have rejoined. That's over 77% retention of our membership. History tells us that is well above the retention rate we have had in previous years (even though total membership was higher). What that also indicates is that while our total numbers may be down from before Covid, the members we have are more active and have a greater possibility to be long time Parrot Heads.

And finally, let's look at one more interesting number. The number of members who did NOT rejoin from 2021 is TOTALLY negated by the new members who joined for 2022. That is a very key number because it indicates that our turnover is fulfilled with new members. So, what does this all mean. It means that our membership remains strong and is each member is more active as we continue to deal with these recent Covid updates.

As always, here's my request: The Website may look impressive and have a lot of cool things and we were proud to have been the PHIP Website of the Year award in 2020. Since the winner is not allowed to compete again, we were mentioned as a great example to follow when PHIP announced the contest for this year. But, as cool as all that is, it is not how our success should be measured. It has to be measured by how often you use the website and how much of it you find important. So, let me know! What do you like? What would you like to see? What is hard for you to do on the site and what is easy. We are always looking to make the website more of a tool for everyone to use.




