




Meeting Of The Minds

Charity News

Results of August Food Drive

The designated food pantry for August was the Lake Panasoffkee Food Pantry. Members contributed \$1,778 in food and \$191 in cash.

September Food Drive

The September food drive will be for the Wildwood Food Pantry. During 2020 this food pantry distributed over 360,600 pounds of food to qualified food insecure families residing in Wildwood, Coleman, Oxford, Royal, Webster, the forest community of Croom-A-Coochee, and other areas in Sumter County. They also support the House of Hope, Anna's House, Casa Hope, Jumper Creek, along with Kids Central organization in Wildwood. For many years they have also shared food donations with the Wildwood Soup Kitchen to help them supply prepared meals for the hungry in the community and surrounding area.

September Shoe Drive

It's time to clean out your closets and donate all of those shoes that are no longer part of your Villages lifestyle. They can be used by the Shepherd's Light House to generate money to help homeless mothers and their children. Your shoes will either be sold at their Bellview thrift store or sold to organizations that provide used clothing to third world countries. **It doesn't matter what kind of shape your shoes are in.**

Shepherd's Lighthouse clients receive housing and meals for up to 6 months. Counseling is offered for employment, child care, housing, medical care, financial assistance, vocational training, and legal aid. This charity provides a path for these mothers and their children to become self-sufficient



and productive members of society. The success rate is wonderful at 83%. We will be collecting your donations at all 3 Phlockings in September. Cash donations are also welcome.

Proposed Amendment to Club's Bylaws

The last time the Club's Bylaws were changed was in 2011. Back then we were a small club. Today we are over 1,200 people and still growing. Our current Bylaws don't allow for the Executive Committee to propose changes. The **only way** the Club's Bylaws can be reviewed/amended or changed is when a member in good standing prepares, circulates, collects a minimum of 10% of member signatures and presents the petitions to the Executive Committee. Once presented to to ExComm, the process of By Law review begins which may or may not result in a vote by the membership to change the By Laws.

The amendment petition I am now circulating will give the Executive Committee the ability to propose Bylaw amendments to the membership without a member petition. Any By Law amendment proposed by the Executive Committee will still be required to go before the membership for a vote.

By Law Proposed Amendment: Article XI. A. 1. The Executive Committee shall be authorized present Bylaw amendments to the Club's membership for approval.

Our Parrot Head Profile this month features Gary Grahn. Gary has been a Villager since 2014. His first home was in the Village of Sunset Cove and then he moved to the Village of Belle Aire. He currently resides in the Village of Duvall right down the street from Havana Country Club. He really likes the central location of his current home with its close proximity to Sumter Landing and Paddock Town Squares.

Gary is originally from Indianapolis, Indiana. He worked in the commercial printing business starting at the age of 13. His family, of German descent, owned the business and when he went to work for them their strong work ethic had him working as hard as any adult on the payroll. When his dad retired and moved to The Villages rather than work for his aunt, the co-owner of the company, they sold the equipment and Gary kept the accounts. He had 37 other companies looking to hire him and ended up working for Priority Press. He worked for them for 15 years and then retired at age 60.

Gary heard about the Parrot Head Club in about 2016 and decided to go to a Phlocking. He liked what he saw, so he joined up! Besides being a Parrot Head, Gary is a member of the Indiana Club, and was a member of an auto racing club which was primarily interested in stock car racing. He actually raced ¼ midget cars when he was 14 and then went on to work on his brothers and sisters cars. He continued to race various types of cars and was very involved in the racing world. If you get a chance to talk to Gary ask him about his experiences. He has lots of interesting stories to tell.

You have probably seen Gary selling 50/50 tickets at some of our recent Phlockings but he is willing to do whatever the club needs him to do. He has helped with attendance, helped set up and tear down for the Chili Cook-off, and has helped Skip with registration for the blood drives from the time they set up until they close down at the end of the day.






