


July 4th Tavares Fireworks

Member Interview

My goal in this interview is to challenge each of you to embrace who you are, and share your resources with this club.

Dave and I have lived in the same home in the village of Gilchrist for 10 years. We joined Parrot Heads in 2013 and have served on many committees such as Security, Travel, New Members, Poker Runs, Golf Tournaments, Blood Drives, and many others. Our interest in this

club, comes from our dedication to service.

Like many others in this club, we shared the same goals of total dedication of service to the greater good of the world. While I was focused on helping others one by one; Dave had goals of a Naval career in the submarine service. We had different paths in our service, but accepted the concept of "independence Operations" to meet our goals. We had to support each other to fully develop our individual core strengths thru sacrifice, and total trust in who we were as individuals. We each wanted to bring our best selves to fulfill our destinies. We formed a lifelong team, but can confidently stand alone when necessary.

Our deep connection with the ocean, beaches and sunshine was nurtured living in Hawaii (1977-1992) near Pearl Harbor. We had 2 Hawaiians, David Jr in 1978, and Dwayne in 1981. Dave went to sea and I went to college. He supported me while I kept the home stable and attended University of Hawaii, while pursuing my master's degree in social work, which specialized in medical, crisis and case management, and military families.

I supported him during 25 of his 30 years of Naval service. We were separated a lot; with 8 consecutive years on sea duty, making 6 deployments in addition to many periods of being apart as duty called. I was the rock at home while pursuing my own goals. I volunteered for 23 years in the Navy Ombudsman program overlapping my 30-year career in social work. I was employed on military mental health contracts. I retired as a therapist at the VA in Ocala. I previously worked in national case management for the medically discharged service members: as a crisis counselor on a national military hotline and as a national trainer for Navy Family Services. I worked 5 years in several hospices.

In Hawaii our family embraced the customs, beauty and opportunities of the islands. Our commitment to service was strengthen by the Hawaiian concepts of Aloha which embraces love, compassion and inner peace. As a result of living so isolated from biological family, we created extended Ohanas. (The family you choose for yourself to love, support and protect.) Our Ohanas were within the military, and community groups. Our sacrifice of being on independent operations strengthened our bond to others.

Another connection to this club was our youngest son Dwayne who also embraced his Hawaiian Roots and the Aloha spirit. He worked at Margaritaville Orlando for 14 years in the kitchen and on the executive training team. Our 2 sons and granddaughter live in Orlando.

Our commitment in this club has resulted in us establishing friendships that will sustain us through life, as we work, play and share our lives with "Our OHana." (PH family) Our advise: "Jump in the deep end and swim with "the Sharketts Ohana."






