


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President's Corner

February Food Drive

The Panty designated for our donations in February is the Christian Food Pantry of Lady Lake and we will be collecting the donations at the Havana Country Club. .

This pantry is a ministry of North Lake Presbyterian Church which opened in 1998. The supplemental grocery program for local families in need, improves their quality of life, helps sustain health, good nutrition, energy, human dignity and the opportunity for family members to meet their full potential. In 1998, Jane Waters and Vernie Miller, members of NLPC, witnessed poverty in the Lady Lake area. They noticed neighbors doing without basic food staples. The two decided they would take action. The Christian Food Pantry was born.

The Villages formed a partnership with NLPC and built a 1150 square foot building in one day! The idea turned into reality and the pantry opened to help local families in need with supplemental groceries. The pantry is an important ministry of North Lake Presbyterian Church helping hundreds of local families.

Food that is often needed:

- Peanut butter
- Canned soup
- Canned fruit
- Canned vegetables
- Canned stew
- Canned fish
- Canned beans
- Pasta (most prefer whole grain)
- Rice (most prefer brown rice)

Giving Program for 2022

Each year the Charity Committee conducts a survey to determine which charities and demographic groups that the Club's membership wants to help. As usual, local veterans, children living in poverty and the homeless were the groups which ranked the highest.

The Giving Program has two parts: cash donations and Cody's fundraisers. In 2022 the plan calls for cash donations to 6 charities and 4 Cody's fundraisers.

March 21 & 22 Blood Drive

We are doing better as a Club but not as good as we can do. Our goal for 2022 is 2,022 pints of blood which means we have 1,634 pints yet to collect. Most of the time we talk about giving blood we talk about the benefits of giving the gift of life to someone in need. Did you know that donating blood is good for you to?

- You get a free health check-up. Before you give blood, a nurse will check your blood pressure, pulse, temperature and hemoglobin levels. Your blood may also be checked for HIV, hepatitis and other diseases.
- 2. **It burns calories.** You can't replace your regular sweat session with a blood donation, but you can burn about 650 calories while donating one pint of blood.
- 3. Your body will make new blood. Think of it like a tuneup for your body. When you donate blood, you generate new blood. It takes about 24 hours to replace the plasma and 4-6 weeks to replace the red blood cells from your donation.
- 4. It may improve your heart health. Donating blood temporarily lowers the iron in your blood. Elevated levels of iron may increase the risk of heart disease in men. One study showed that men who donated blood at least once a year had an 88% lower risk of heart attacks than men who were not donors.
- 5. It promotes well-being. Yours, that is! Giving blood can make you feel good about yourself, reduce stress and improve your emotional health.
- 6. **It only takes an hour.** The process of donating blood is simple and quick. You'll likely be there for about an hour, although the actual blood donation only takes about 10 minutes.
- 7. It doesn't really hurt. You may feel a slight prick when the needle is inserted into your arm but the process is relatively painless. And when you consider the benefits it provides, the minor discomfort is well worth it.
- 8. You may need a blood donation one day. It's estimated that about 25% of people will need blood at least once in their lives. Although there's no direct correlation between giving blood and receiving it, you may be as grateful one day as someone else currently is for the donation.

What Does Being A Parrot Head Mean?

When you become a member of the Villages Parrot Head Club, you also become a member of the official Jimmy Buffett Fan Club: the Parrot Heads in Paradise Inc. which is the parent organization of our Club. This organization engages in activities that are charitable, educational and that promote the general welfare of the community. Parrot Heads in Paradise, Inc. is a Not-For-Profit Corporation, whose purpose is to assist in community and environmental concerns and provide a variety of social activities for people who are interested in the music of Jimmy Buffett and the tropical lifestyle he personifies. We live up to our Club's moto: Party with a Purpose.

This madness started with one club in Atlanta (founder, Scott Nickerson) and has blossomed to a network of over 200 clubs around the U.S. plus international clubs based in Canada, Europe, the Caribbean and Australia.

In 2021 our Club contributed \$114,896 in cash and donations along with 8,967 of volunteer hours to charitable causes. Since our Club was chartered, we've raised \$2,756,606 for charities and volunteered 89,388 hours.

The Story of Jimmy Buffett (Part 1) by Mark "the Shark" (with help from Wikipedia)

James William Buffett (born December 25, 1946) is a singersongwriter, musician, author, actor, and businessman. He is best known for his music, which often portrays an "island escapism" lifestyle.

Together with his Coral Reefer Band, Jimmy Buffett has recorded hit songs including "Margaritaville" (ranked 234th on the Recording Industry Association of America's list of "Songs of the Century") and "Come Monday". He has a devoted base of fans known as "Parrot Heads". According to Discography, Buffet has 29 studio albums, 9 compilation albums, 8 specialty albums, and 67 singles.

Aside from his career in music, Buffett is also a bestselling author and was involved in two restaurant chains named after two of his best-known songs. Hhe owns The Margaritaville Cafe restaurant chain and co-developed the now closed Cheeseburger in Paradise restaurant chain. Buffett is one of the world's richest musicians, with a net worth of \$900 million. (to be continued!)


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

2021 Villages Parrot Head's Club Annual Report

Once again, it is my honor to submit The Villages Parrot Heads Club's annual report highlighting major club events undertaken by our members. We are fortunate and proud to have the world's largest Parrot Head club membership and our membership is very generous and active as you will see.

As with most clubs, we started out the year in limbo, not knowing where we were headed. But our members were up to the challenge. We finished strong, as we are back to having 3 phlockings a month, numerous fundraisers, and other events where our club members could "Party with a Purpose".

While we were shut down, our members commitment to help others was second to none. We held driveway parties with entertainment where everyone could spread out to their own comfort level and enjoy the day. Each one had a food drive, and we continued our food drives each month at a phlocking when they returned in May. I am happy to report that our members donated over \$9,189 in food, supplies and cash for our local food pantries.

Even this pandemic did not slow our members and their friends from participating in our five blood drives. In the early part of the year, we gathered outside, so everyone could feel safe. They even braved one of the coldest/windiest days in February, outside, to donate the give of helping others by giving blood. After the outside drives we were fortunate to be back in the friendly confines of Firehouse #44 where we have always had our blood drives. I am excited to report that through our drives, we were able to donate 1913 pints of blood to those in need. Another way to look at it is 239½ gallons of blood. As each pint of blood can help save the life of up to 3 people, we were able to help 5,739 people. We then helped the firehouse with their fire prevention by stuffing goodie bags for their fire prevention night. Being a former Battalion Chief in the fire department, I could not be prouder of our members.

As we do each summer, we held a fund drive for the Wildwood Middle School to help the children. Members donated over \$830 worth of school supplies and we finished with a day at Cody's Roadhouse with entertainment and collected \$3,000 in cash which we donated to the school. The new principal was overwhelmed.

In September, we held a shoe drive where members could donate new or slightly used shoes which were donated to Shepherd's Lighthouse which is an organization that helps people navigate homeless single mothers through life's storms by rescuing, empowering, and renewing their lives. We donated \$3,600 worth of shoes and also gave them \$1,050 cash to help their needs.

We held 2 more fundraisers at Cody's Roadhouse in which we donated \$2,200 to Operation Shoebox in September, and \$2,000 to the Marion County SPCA in November.

Also in November, one of our members held a Candy Cane drive-by party, at his home, for the Marine Corp Toys-4-Tots program. Our members and friends donated over \$2,000 in cash and toys for the kids.

In 2022, we have our Annual Golf cart and basket Raffle for Charity already scheduled for March. This is a big fundraising effort and our members put in many hours. We also will be scheduling our Annual Golf Tournament this year to help fund Alzheimer's research.

In closing, I would like to praise our members who, in a year when we started all couped up and were asked to social distance, we finished on a high note. Our members helped raise \$111,896 in cash and in-kind donations and worked 8967 volunteer hours. In Florida, the value of one volunteer hour is \$23.07, with the value of these hours being \$206,867. In total, our club was responsible for over \$321,763 in charity work.

As I stated before these are just some of the many activities our club undertakes. We are always striving to leave the world a little better than we found it. I am extremely proud of the members of our club who participate and work so hard to make our club the success it is.
