

Editors Pick: 2023's First Drink A Bloody Mary!

This month the editor of this newsletter is going to select a drink to start 2023. A French bartender by the name of Fernand Petiot claimed to have invented the Bloody Mary in 1921. According to his granddaughter, he was working at the New York Bar in Paris, which later became Harry's New York Bar and was a frequent Paris hangout for Ernest Hemingway and other American migrants. The original cocktail is said to have been created on the spur of the moment, according to the bar's own traditions, consisting only of vodka and tomato juice.

There are hundreds of recipes for the Bloody Mary cocktail. This is Emeril Lagasse's recipe for a pitcher.

Ingredients

- 8 cups thick tomato juice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon celery salt
- 2 teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 2 teaspoons Tabasco sauce
- 10 ounces vodka
- Crushed ice

Directions

Pour the tomato juice into a large pitcher. Stir in the salt, celery

salt, pepper, lemon juice, lime juice, Worcestershire, tabasco and vodka. Chill for at least 1 hour and then pour into tall glasses with crushed ice and mix. Garnish with whatever you like. I like bacon.
