




# December 2021 Edition




## Member Advocate

## Coco-Nutz Monthly Meeting



# Member Interview



Our Parrot Head Profile this month features a new member as well as a corporate sponsor, Brandt Bell of StreetRod fame! Brandt and his wife Stacey have been residents of Yalaha since February. They live just about a mile from the wonderful Yalaha Bakery.

Brandt is originally from Maryland. He attended Embry-Riddle College in Daytona, Florida and then returned to Maryland for work. He is an avid golfer and in his previous life was a golf pro. He was also involved in car sales up in Maryland. Brandt's mom had a home in Florida and one in Maryland and when she had knee replacement surgery he came down to help her out. After returning to Maryland she had two knee replacements at once so in order to be of more help to her decided to move the family down to Florida.

Our corporate sponsor Streetrods first employed Brandt as Sales Manager and he is now their General Manager. Streetrods was founded in 1995 and have made 3500 carts and no two are identical! The golf carts are based on cars from the 20's, 30's and 40's and are built to 5/8<sup>th</sup> scale. They are available in either gas or electric. Their parent company is the Pritchard Company which has been around since 1913 and fifth generation Pritchards still run the company. They have a history of donating to good causes like the John Daly Lionheart Foundation and the Bill Murray Cady Shack.

The Parrot Head Club was brought to Brandt's attention because two of his salesmen, Lynn Henry and Gary Grahn, and the accounts manager, Mary Jane Stewart are club members. In fact you may have seen the interviews with Lynn Henry and Gary Grahn in previous newsletters. Perhaps you have seen our club president, Mark Woodland's, really cool Streetrod fire truck, a great example of the unique carts they build. Brandt has been to a few of our Phlockings to make check presentations and what he's seen is a bunch of retired people having a good time and supporting good causes. He says it's a good mix for everybody.



**STATUS UPDATE:** Let's take a quick look at where we are right now: MEMBERSHIP- WOW! Close to half of our members have already taken advantage of the advance membership discount. However, we still have over 550 of you that haven't. We are in the final month so get your 2022 membership now. And do you know we already have over 80 people who have become new members for 2022. Welcome!

Our Holiday Party is all sold out. This was our first "Select your table" event. How did it go? Well, we may have hit a few bumps, but we certainly didn't have any major sinkholes. Many of the questions surrounded the use of volunteer points and the new methodology of allowing the use of one person's points to accommodate the pts needed for the table. With a 3 point per ticket requirement, any combination of attendees that added up to an average of 3 pts per attendee made sitting with friends even more accessible. And what about the concern that, if we use points, then nobody without points will be able to get a ticket. Well, out of 288 tickets, 191 tickets were sold to members with points. The entire balance went to those without points and took over two days to sell out. So, if you wanted tickets, you were able to get them even two days after they went on sale. There were very few phone calls or emails from members with problems and EVERY ONE of them was resolved and they were able to get tickets. The only communications I received from people who could not get tickets came after the two days when tickets were sold out. So, if you ever have an issue, PLEASE contact me. We'll do our best to resolve the issue.

**NEXT EVENT- NEW YEAR'S EVE PARTY:** This week the NEW YEAR'S EVE PARTY tickets will go on sale. We will do them in a similar manner. First members who have accumulated an average of 3 points per ticket can buy tickets starting NOON on DEC 1 and General Membership can buy tickets beginning NOON on DEC 3<sup>rd</sup>. There is a maximum of 6 tickets per order. [Here are copies of the Seating Chart, the Online Seat Selection and the Select Your Table and Seats views.](#) The **Seating Chart** (1) is a copy of what the floor will look like. You will see this when you go to the Event Purchasing screen. The **Online Seat Selection Chart** (2) is what you will see on the purchasing system when you click on "choose your own seats". Simply select the section and you will see the "table"(3) (looks like a row) with the same number as the **Seating Chart**. Note that some tables have 8 seats and others have 10. In the picture below, (4) table 34 is circled in both the **Seating Chart** as well as in the **Select Your Table and Seats** Chart. The grayed out seats have already been sold.
